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

## Toyota Elephant Passage

- 1** Listen to the sounds under the bridge. When you hear a dog barking, a goat bleating, or an insect buzzing, spin in a circle.
- 2** Pose like “Ganesh” and have a loved one take your photo. Do you think the sculpture is pretty? What about Ganesh is different than you?
- 3** Go to the Leopard Log and climb, bounce and pounce like a clouded leopard.
- 4** Name three things an elephant can do with its trunk. Pretend to walk like an elephant swinging its trunk.
- 5** Spin the prayer wheels and make a wish for the animals.
- 6** How many shapes can you find on the tapestry wall in the village market? Imagine you’re shopping in this market – what would you buy?
- 7** Watch the otters and fishing cat. Do you think they are shy or playful? Do you ever act like they do? Crawl under the otter window to get a view from inside their exhibit!
- 8** Tough or tender? Touch the rhino skin and compare it to your own. Which is rough and which is soft?
- 9** Why do gibbons have such long arms? Swing like a gibbon on the bar at the Brachiation Station.
- 10** What was the biggest animal you saw in Toyota Elephant Passage? The smallest? Now, act like them both!
