Important Information

Welcome to Summer Safari 2010! A fun-filled educational experience for animal lovers from preschool to those going into eighth grade. Campers participate in hands-on activities, animal visits and observations, crafts, games, stories, projects, and zoo tours. *To make your child's program enjoyable and safe, please read carefully the following information.*

Camp Start & End Times

Please note the start times for your child's class/classes printed on your confirmation paper work. Arrival after class start time could result in missed tours, animal encounters, or other activities as well as late arrival fees. **Please plan ahead, as all parents or guardians MUST sign their child in and out of the camp program in person.** The camp week is four days long, with an overnight program on Thursday evening. See the calendar below for a visual representation of the Middle School Camp schedule.

***NOTE:** *If your child elects to NOT participate in the Career Camp Overnight experience built into the cost and program curriculum (4pm Thursday to 9am Friday), they should be picked up at 4:00 p.m. on Thursday, and dropped off at 9:00 a.m. on Friday.*

****NOTE:** *Friday late care pick up will occur between 4:00-5:30 pm unless special arrangements are made.*

Registered Early & Late Care

If your child is registered for Early Drop-Off care, you and your child may enter through the zoo's Main Entrance between 7:30 and 8:45am. Once inside, proceed to the Grasslands Studio in the Gates Education Center to complete the Check-In process. Please note that after 8:45am, all Early Drop-Off participants should check in at Gate #1.

If your child is registered for Late Pick-Up care, you may enter through the zoo's Main Entrance between 4:15 and 5:30pm. Once inside, proceed to the Grasslands Studio in the Gates Education Center to complete the Check-Out process. **Photo ID will be REQUIRED EVERY DAY** to pick your child up from camp.

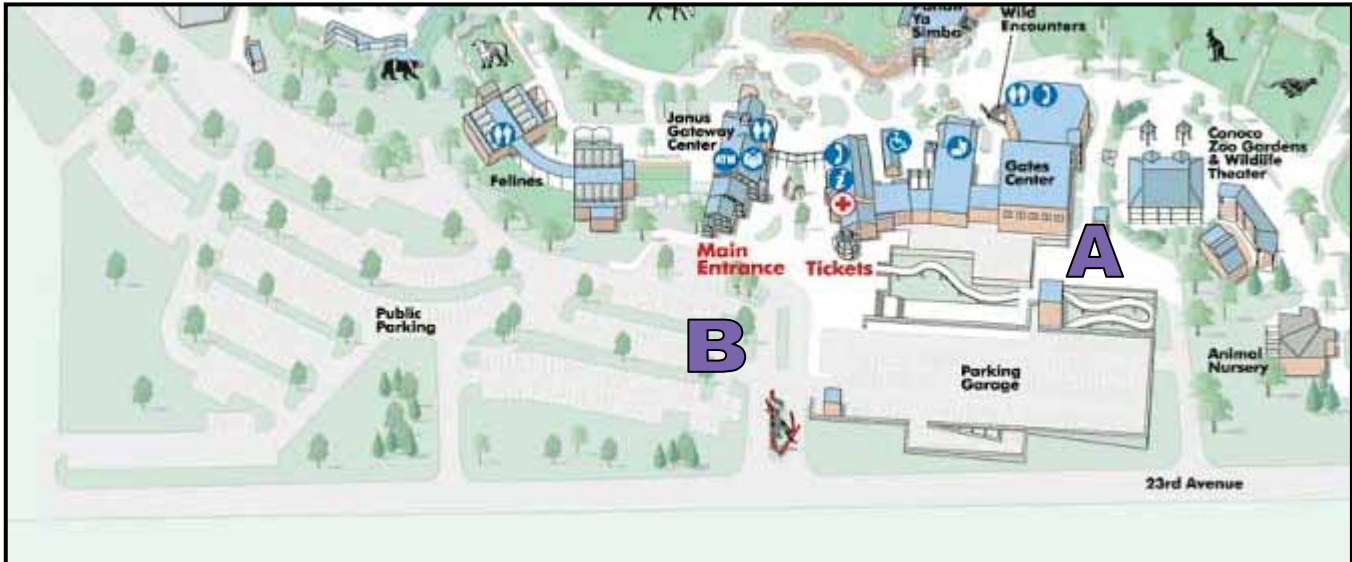
REMINDER: You must be *Pre-registered* for early drop-off and/or late pick-up options. You can log back into the online registration system and add this option up to a week before camp begins.

CHECK-IN, CHECK-OUT and Parking

Camp check-in and check-out will be in your child's classrooms in the Gates Education Center! Please read details below, to help us ensure a smooth process.

CHECK-IN

Check-in for camp will be through the Special Programs Gate (a.k.a. Gate #1). This gate is located 1000 feet to the west (or to the right) of the zoo's main entrance, directly across from the elevators in the parking garage. Please see a map of the parking and camp check-in areas below.

- Upon turning into Denver Zoo's main driveway, follow the signs to the designated parking areas. You may park either in the parking garage (on your right) or in the designated Special Programs parking area (on your left). For morning check-in, the parking garage will be your closest and most convenient parking area. Please note that the reserved Special Programs area is a 30-minute only drop-off and pick-up zone, monitored by Zoo Security. Your Summer Safari dashboard parking pass provides you access to this reserved parking. If you are planning to stay and enjoy the zoo, you will not be able to park in this 30-minute reserved parking zone.
- § **Please make sure to have your "Summer Safari 2010" dashboard parking pass visible so that the security officer on duty can properly direct you to the designated parking areas.**
- § Please arrive on time. The camp gate opens and check-in begins promptly at 9:00am. You will need to walk your child to their assigned class, designated by the class signs inside and outside the Gates Education Center. Your child's instructors will guide you through the check-in process.
- § If you have children in two different classes, you will need to check each of them in, in the respective room/area for each class. Although Monday check-in is a little longer than other days, most check-in lines do move very quickly.
- § Please bring your completed First Day of Camp Check-list & turn it in to your child's instructor.
- § Please remain with your child until his/her check-in is completed.
- § This is a drop-off program for registered, age appropriate children only.

Drop-offs more than 15 minutes late will be charged an accommodation fee. Please refer to the "Service Charges & Accommodation Fees" section.

CHECK-OUT

Check-out for camp will be through the same Special Programs Gate (a.k.a. Gate #1) as check-in. You will be picking your child up either directly from their classroom in the Gates Education Center, or from a special camp tent outside the Gates Education Center.

- § Upon turning into Denver Zoo's main driveway, follow the signs to the designated parking areas. You may park either in the parking garage (on your right) or in the designated Special Programs parking area (on your left).
 - For 4pm check-out, the parking garage will be your closest parking area, where zoo Security officers will help direct you to reserved parking on the top level (when available). The Special Programs parking area to the left of the zoo's main driveway is also available for 4pm check-out.
 - For pick up at NOON on the last day of camp, the reserved Special Programs parking will be your best bet for quick parking, during this peak time at the zoo.
- § Please make sure to have your "Summer Safari 2010" dashboard parking pass visible so that the security officer on duty can properly direct you to the designated parking areas.
- § Proceed with your Photo I.D. to the Special Programs Gate (a.k.a. Gate #1). At 4:00pm (or Noon for the final day of camp), camp administrators will open the gate and you can continue to your child's classroom or camp tent for check-out.
- § If you have children in two different classes, you will go to each of their classrooms and have your I.D. checked at each one. Check-out lines do move fast, so delays should be minimal.
- § **Photo ID will be REQUIRED EVERY DAY** to pick your child up from camp. *Please note: For safety reasons your camper WILL NOT be released to any person not on their Authorized Pick-up list, including your spouse, or to anyone without proper photo ID.* Please review and update your campers Authorized Pick-up List with your campers' instructor on the first day of camp.

Please pick your child up at the designated check-out time. *Pick-ups more than 15 minutes late will be charged a late pick-up accommodation fee, and child will be transferred to our Late Care room in the Gates Education Center. Please refer to the "Service Charges & Accommodation Fees" section.*

While your child is in camp

If you are planning to spend the day at the zoo, we have several restaurant/food stations located throughout the zoo, as well as a large gift shop and coffee bar. If you decide to tour the zoo, we ask that you tour different areas than your child's camp class. This is to ensure that your participant can fully enjoy the benefits of interacting with the other children in his/her class. The added benefit for your child is learning to remain only with his/her instructors and tour guides, which aids us with our security precautions, as well as helps your child learn important group skills. We greatly appreciate your cooperation.

FOOD

SNACKS

Your child's camp program includes a healthy & fun snack. All participants in Summer Safari will receive a daily snack, both in the morning and afternoon. If your child has special dietary needs, (including **ANY** food allergies) you may wish to make your own accommodations for snack – please call us as soon as possible to discuss the situation. Please note: all Denver Zoo provided snacks and lunches are nut-free.

LUNCH

Participants in full-day programs **MUST** either bring a sack lunch from home every day (*please note, we do not provide refrigeration of lunches*), or purchase lunch for the entire week of Summer Safari.

- § Zoo lunch entrees will vary daily but may include sandwiches, hot dogs, tacos, macaroni and cheese, chicken nuggets or pizza, and servings of fruit and vegetables daily.
- § Cost is \$35/week per camper.
- § If you did not sign-up for the lunch option upon registration you may do so now, but please contact us prior to your child's camp week.

If your child has special dietary needs, (including **ANY** food allergies) you may wish to make your own accommodations for lunch – please call us in advance to discuss the situation.

Special Needs/Concerns, Allergies or Medication

ALLERGIES

Please call us immediately if your child has any allergies, including food allergies, which were not noted in the online registration process.

MEDICATIONS

The Denver Zoo **CANNOT** dispense medication *of any kind*, except for epi-pens in an emergency situation. This includes, but is not limited to, aspirin, benedryl, cold medications, etc. We are also unable to perform any medical testing, including blood sugar monitoring. If your child needs daily medication that they cannot administer themselves, please contact us so that we can make arrangements for you, or a designated care giver, to come to the zoo to administer the necessary medication and/or testing. Please let your instructor know if your child has any medications with them at camp, including over the counter medication.

SPECIAL NEEDS & CONCERNS

If your child has special needs that should be evaluated on an individual basis or there are special concerns we should be aware of, please contact us at 303-376-4836. We are more than happy to discuss all options available to you and your child. If your child needs to attend camp with his/her full time care provider, special arrangements can be made to accommodate that situation. The adult caregiver will attend at no charge.

Please Note: If your child has severe allergies or medical conditions that require him/her to carry an epi-pen or medication, you must complete and return the Summer Safari Day Camp Medication Authorization form. This form can be downloaded from the Summer Safari webpage, or you may request one be emailed to you, by contacting us at safari@denverzoo.org. Please complete this form before your child's camp week and send back to Denver Zoo, Attn: Summer Safari, 2300 Steele St., Denver, CO 80205.

Weather

Many of the zoo's exhibits are outside. Camp will take place in any type of weather. Planned outdoor activities will occur "rain, snow, heat or shine", so please bring appropriate clothing and gear. In *extreme* weather conditions, indoor activities may be substituted for outdoor activities.

What to Bring (Please mark your items with a name & phone #)

- *Lunch* (if you have not signed up for the zoo lunch option)
- *Appropriate clothing for camp activities.* Dress for the weather, and please be aware that many of our art projects use glue, paint and other materials that may be messy. Paint shirts will be provided, but please consider the overall program when choosing the appropriate clothing.
- *Summer Safari 2010 Camp T-shirts* will be issued at the end of the first day of camp. To aid us with identification and safety precautions, we ask that campers **wear their camp shirts every day**. If you would like to purchase additional shirts, please contact us by March 30th.
- *Comfortable walking shoes or boots. Flip-flops are not recommended.*
- *Hat or sunglasses, if desired.*
- *Small lunch or tote bag, if necessary* (please be aware that your child will be carrying his/her own items...please pack lightly and consider what will be provided by the zoo.)

What NOT to Bring

- Electronic devices such as radios, walkmans or video games.
- Entertainment items such as games, toys, puzzles and books. There will be lots to do! ☺
- Nonessential items like jewelry and valuables are discouraged. Denver Zoo is not responsible for lost or stolen items.
- Cell phones are discouraged, except for emergency use.

What will be Provided

- Water will be available in all the classrooms, as well as on tour. We take hydration seriously; we make ample stops for water, and have fun measures in place to encourage kids to drink.
- Water and juice are available with snack. (Zoo-lunch option includes milk or water).
- Sunscreen is available at the check-in gate and kids will be encouraged to apply before going on tour. We do suggest you apply sunscreen at home before dropping them off.

Supervision

There is a staff to child ratio of approximately 1 to 10. Experienced, trained, adult instructors and volunteers will lead the group in activities, games, and tours. Teen volunteers also assist as classroom aides. All staff and volunteers have undergone extensive background checks and are highly trained in Summer Safari programs and working with children. They are here to ensure a safe, fun, educational experience for your child.

Lost and Found

Lost items will be held in the Summer Safari Lost and Found until the end of the day on the Monday following the camp week. Please call 303-376-4836 within that time period. After that time period items will be taken to the zoo's main Lost and Found. Please contact Zoo Lost and Found directly at 303-376-2828 if you discover an item is missing after your camp session has ended.

Cancellations, Refunds or Changing Camp Dates

Once you receive your Booking Confirmation, Denver Zoo adheres to a **no refund** cancellation policy. We will do our best to try to accommodate an emergency change in registration, but historically, Summer Safari camps sell out, making switching classes extremely difficult once you are registered. In the case of an emergency, please contact us at 303-376-4836 or by email: safari@denverzoo.org. If the zoo must cancel a program, full refunds will be issued.

Service Charges & Accommodation Fees

We are happy to accommodate special prearranged situations which require your child to be dropped off late for camp or picked up early. With advance notice, children may be dropped off or picked up during lunch time (noon-1:00pm) at no charge.

For all other times, the following accommodation fees apply:

- Dropping off after camp start time.....\$5/instance/camper
- Picking up before camp end time.....\$5/instance/camper
- Picking up child more than 15 min. late, after camp end time...\$10/every 15 minutes late

All early pickups or late drop offs must be pre-arranged with camp administration. Please call or email (303-376-4836 or safari@denverzoo.org.) or speak with a camp administrator (not instructors) at camp check-in/check-out.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q. Can I bring an unregistered child to the camp and register them when we arrive?

A. Registrations must be taken care of in advance, and participants must be of the appropriate age for the program. Summer Safari fills very quickly, and we **CANNOT** accommodate on-site registration.

Q. Can I switch classes on the first day of camp?

A. No. We are unable to rearrange registrants once the camp week has started. Summer Safari classes do sell out, and it is rare, even before camp starts, that space is available for switching programs.

Q. Can I stay with my child for the camp program?

A. This camp program is a drop off program for all ages. It is designed to encourage interaction among participants of the same age, without parents.

Q. Can I register my younger child for middle school camp? (My 5th grader in the 6th-8th grade class?)

A. Your child must be of appropriate age/grade for the camp session in which you are enrolling them. For all classes, your child must be enrolled in a class that matches the grade they will be entering in the fall of 2010. The programs are designed with specific activities appropriate for each developmental stage. Selecting the program that is age/grade appropriate for your child will provide them with the best overall experience. If you have a unique circumstance relating to age, please contact us before registering.

Q. Is there a First Aid and CPR trained individual on staff at all times?

A. Yes, there is 24-hour security at the zoo and all security personnel are First Aid and CPR Certified, as are camp administrators.

Q. My child has a Doctors appointment before/during camp time. What should I do?

A. If your child has an essential appointment that dictates that you pick them up early, or drop them off late to camp we can accommodate requests *made in advance*. Consider dropping off or picking up between Noon and 1pm, our window where there is no charge for late drop-off or early pick-up. For all other times, the appropriate "Accommodation Fees" (see Service Charges & Accommodation Fees section) will apply. Contact Summer Safari administrators at camp, or at 303-376-4836, to make advance arrangements. Your child's camp instructor cannot OK an early pick-up or late drop-off.

Q. Who do I call if there is an emergency?

A. Please call 303-376-4836 OR 303-376-4837 for any Summer Safari participant-related emergency.

Q. I am concerned about leaving my child at camp. What safety measures do you take?

A. Your child's safety and well-being are our top priority. All of our staff members and volunteers have completed extensive background checks, and are trained to work with children. For their safety, we ask that your child wear his/her Summer Safari T-shirt each camp day. All campers receive a color coded lanyard that they will wear every day. All instructors and tour guides carry radios so they may be in contact with our camp administrators at all times. Our 24-hour security staff and camp administrators are CPR and First Aid trained. Camp check-in & out procedures are specifically designed and executed with your child's safety in mind. If you have additional concerns, please feel free to contact us.

Important Information

For Summer Safari Middle School Camp Overnight

Welcome to your overnight adventure at Denver Zoo! To make your child's stay enjoyable and safe, please read the following information carefully.

Program Start & End Times

Please note that your child's overnight adventure begins promptly at 4:00 p.m., immediately following the day's activities at camp. Activities are planned from 4:00 p.m. to 9:00 a.m. the following day, when normal camp hours resume. If you have chosen to not have your child participate in the overnight portion of this week's program, parents or guardians must sign their child out of and into the program in person (check out at 4pm and check in at 9am), with a camp staff member at the Gates Wildlife Conservation Education Center.

If your child is not participating in the overnight:

Parking for Pick Up AND Drop-off

As is the case for other days during your child's camp week, the most convenient parking will be on Level 2 of the parking garage. Once parked, make your way up the steps to Gate 1, across from the parking garage and near the Gates Wildlife Conservation Education Center. This is the gate to the west of the Main Entrance. A camp staff member will meet you just prior to 4:00 p.m. for check-out if you have elected to not have your child participate in the overnight. Drop-off on Friday morning after the overnight will be scheduled for 9:00 a.m. Please remain with your child at Gate one until check-in is completed.

Please note that pick-ups more than 15 minutes late will be charged a late pick-up Accommodation Fee.

Weather

Many of the zoo's exhibits are outside. Your child's overnight adventure will take place in any type of weather. Planned outdoor activities will occur, "rain, snow or shine", so please help them pack appropriate clothing and gear. In *extreme* weather conditions, indoor activities may be substituted for outdoor activities and we reserve the right to cancel a program under extreme circumstances.

Late Arrival /Early Departure FROM OVERNIGHT

Due to planned tours and program activities led by staff and to security lock-down of the zoo after public hours, late arrivals and early departures from the overnight are difficult to accommodate. After public hours, all participants must be escorted to and from the main gates by a camp staff member.

If someone in your party is considering a late arrival or early departure from the camp overnight, please be aware of the following:

- You must contact the Summer Safari registration line (303-376-4836) **at least 1 week prior to your program date** to arrange the late arrival or early departure.
- Late Arrivals and Early Departures from the overnight portion of camp are subject to the \$5 per person Accommodation Fee that applies to Summer Safari..
- Unplanned departures due to illness or emergency situations are not subject to fees.

FOOD

Your Overnight program includes a pizza dinner, evening snack and breakfast. (See *sample menu below*). Outside food and beverages are not allowed. Please alert us of any food allergies upon receipt of this confirmation packet (allergies should also be noted on the roster forms you will return to us). If there is someone with highly sensitive dietary needs, you may wish to make your own accommodations for this person – please call us as soon as possible to discuss the situation.

Overnight Program Menus may include the following, but are subject to substitution:

Dinner:	A selection of pizza (i.e. cheese, pepperoni, mushroom, pineapple) Fresh veggies and ranch dip Lemonade or juice, water
Evening Snack:	Fresh sliced fruit String cheese Popcorn Lemonade or hot cocoa, water
Breakfast:	Breakfast burritos (egg and cheese) Pancakes or waffles Selection of cereals Fruit Orange Juice, Milk, Water

Sleeping Accommodations

Your child will be sleeping on non-padded floors in a studio or classroom of the Gates Wildlife Conservation Education Center, supervised by staff. Girls and boys will be sleeping in separate rooms. *It is highly recommended that participants bring foam ground pads or air mattresses for extra comfort.* Bathrooms are located in close proximity to the sleeping areas.

What to Bring (It's a good idea to label your items with a name & phone #)

- **Foam pad or air mattress** (*Highly recommended. Sleeping on hard floors is uncomfortable*)
- Sleeping bag and pillow
- Appropriate clothing; pajamas or sweats for sleeping (*dress for the weather, and consider layers. Indoor and outdoor temperatures can vary greatly*).
- Comfortable walking shoes or boots
- Personal toiletries such as toothpaste, toothbrushes, soap, washcloth, etc. (*Please note that no shower or bathing facilities are available*).
- Camera (Note that no outdoor pictures can be taken on zoo tours *after dark*)
- In summer, mosquito repellent & sunscreen (*Denver Zoo is a proactive West Nile testing site, taking preventative measures, but we do recommend taking the precaution of mosquito repellent*)
- Your favorite stuffed animal 😊

What NOT to Bring

- Flashlights
- Electronic devices such as hair dryers, curling irons, radios, mp3 player/i-pod, or video games.
- Gum, food, snacks or beverages.
- Nonessential items like jewelry and valuables are discouraged. Denver Zoo is not responsible for lost or stolen items.
- Cell phones are discouraged, except for emergency use.

Supervision

Adult Summer Safari Overnight staff and volunteers will lead the group in activities, games, and tours. All staff and volunteers have undergone background checks and are experienced in Bunk with the Beasts Overnight programs and working with children of all ages. They are here to ensure a safe, fun, educational experience for your child.

Cancellations, Refunds or Additions

Summer Safari adheres to a no refund cancellation policy. If you willingly opt out of the overnight experience built into the Middle School Camp curriculum, the cost of your camp week will remain the same. If the zoo must cancel a program, however, full refunds will be issued.

Security/Lost and Found/First Aid

Denver Zoo has 24 hour security officers, trained in first aid and CPR. If you need to reach your child during their overnight adventure (for emergencies only, please), you can call the Security Office at 303-376-4805. Lost items will be taken to the zoo's main Lost and Found. Please contact Lost and Found directly at 303-376-2828 if you discover an item is missing after the overnight.

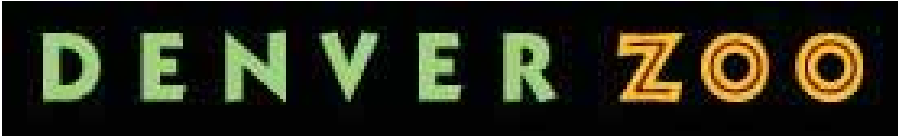
Frequently Asked Questions
