Fantastical Beasts – Unicorn and Pegasus

Questions of the Day: Can animal horns or antlers grow too big, long, sharp, etc. for the animal? Why would this matter?

Your unicorn/Pegasus has injured its horn/wing. What caused the injury and how would you fix it?

Zoo Exploration: Ranges (Horses, Bongos, Elands, Kudus), Greater One-Horned Rhino. Could animals with horns, hooves, and antlers become problems for them or get injured?

Animal Experience: Which animal(s) did we meet in our classroom? Why did we meet these?

Engineering Challenge: Design a way to help your mythical creature that became injured. What happened, and how did you solve it?

Further Exploration: Campers' Choice! Did we see any other animals that have body parts that have gotten extra help to mend?

Taking it Home: Why is it sometimes difficult to care for zoo animals? What challenges do they present that are similar to those of an animal you might have as a pet?
